



Decorations Must Follow Guidelines

She is married to Gary DeBoer and lives in Beatrice. She has 3 adult chil-


dren and 6 grandchildren. Her favorite past times include gardening, outdoor activities and spending time with her family.


We are excited to have Laura join our Gardenside family!

Help us keep residents healthy!

As we head into cold and flu season, we ask everyone to help us keep our residents healthy.

If you would like to call your loved one you can always call our desk at 402-729-5220 and we will make sure you can talk to your loved one.

We have hand sanitizer by the doorways and recommend that you use hand sanitizer both coming and go-

ing, for the protection of our residents and your own health. We also have masks by the doors—so if you must visit and have any symptoms (scratchy throat, cough, etc.) you are welcome to use a mask.

If our community experiences a high incidence of influenza, we may at times require masking for anyone who has not had an influenza vaccination, we may not allow large groups to come to volunteer or entertain, and we may at times recommend no one visit. These decisions are made based on the community incidence of influenza or other illnesses.
