### **COVID Precautions**

An uptick in positive tests among Gardenside's staff and residents in January meant we went into the Modified Yellow Zone. Residents have been eating in their rooms, residents and staff are being tested twice a week, and residents could be out of their rooms if masked and participating in distanced activities. Residents with positive COVID tests have been placed in red zone for closer monitoring and remained in their room/zone for 10 days until symptoms resolved. Those with positive results are experiencing mild cold symptoms.

Readers might notice that in some photos residents are masked and in others they are not. Prior to the need to go into Modified Yellow Zone, residents were able to be out of their room without masks.
