Richard "Dick" Bugbee was the first recipient to see a "bucklet list" wish come true. Dick had had a stroke and became dependent on staff for transfers and a lift to move from one place to another. Dick was frustrat-





ed because he wanted to be able to go to the family car for church and other functions. He told Director of Nursing Laura DeBoer RN "I will do whatever it takes to get into a car again." He continued to work hard with Karen Spilker, rehab aide, 4-5 times a week to build up his strength. He used the Nu-Step bicycle most days and was eventually able to start walking short distances with Karen, but still needed the lift. He made so much progress, but was still weak in the right leg. Toward the end of July he asked Laura "Could we please try to get me into a car now?" Laura worked with Wayne Franzen, day shift activity coordinator, on how to make this happen. Wayne knew Dick had a love for Cadillacs, and offered to bring his Cadillac to work. On Aug. 2, Laura escorted Dick to the front entry of JCH&L in his wheelchair to the beautiful shiny black Cadillac, where Wayne was waiting to make Dick's dream come true. Wayne opened the car door and Laura got things ready to assist Dick out of the wheelchair—and before Laura could get out of the way Dick was standing up and put himself in the Cadillac. He nearly knocked Laura out of the way to get in. As Laura and Wayne were buckling him up he said, "Load the cooler, let's go!" Dick was smiling ear to ear.

Wayne drove Dick to Steele City and areas he wanted to see out in the county. When he returned, Dick was smiling ear to ear and told everyone he met in the hallway what he had just done. He looked at Laura and said: "If I die today, I will be the happiest man."

These are truly the "moments" that are embedded in our minds as health care workers to keep doing what we love. The simplest things to us are the biggest things to our elders.



### **COVID Precautions**

Because of our county's COVID numbers, Gardenside unvaccinated and unboosted staff are testing routinely. Because no cases have been reported among Gardenside residents, residents are able to share meals in the dining room, and participate in activities together. Residents can be out of their rooms (unless they have symptoms and are waiting for a test result.) Although residents are not required to mask when they are out of their rooms, masking is encouraged. Residents are not required to be tested unless they have symptoms.

Visitors continue to be screened before entering and MUST continue to abide by the strict core principals of infection control: masking, social distancing and good hand hygiene. If they are not able to comply they will be asked to leave. Visitors must also understand there is a risk that they could be exposed to COVID while visiting. Appointments are encouraged by calling (402)-729-5220.

Visitors continue to use Door 31. Door 31 is now unlocked from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Once inside the breezeway, visitors must screen at the kiosk, and then use the doorbell on the west wall to let staff know you are ready to visit. Staff will then allow you entrance to the Gardenside door.

Residents are allowed to go out of the facility for outings with family. We encourage them to avoid large gatherings. Staff appreciates a 24-hour notice to ensure proper paperwork is completed. Please call 402-729 -5220 Monday through Friday to schedule outings.
