Gardenside Recognized by ICAP for Vaccination Status

The Infection Control Assessment and Promotion Program (ICAP) has recognized JCH&L Gardenside with Gold Status for having more than 90 percent of residents fully vaccinated. A certificate was presented showing Gardenside as one of the six long-term care facilities in the state with more than 90 percent of residents fully vaccinated.

Director of Nursing Laura DeBoer said: All of our elders were more than willing to take their COVID series and boosters. Most felt it was their "duty" to get these vaccines to protect themselves, and others. One gentlemen said "Why wouldn't I get it?" We discussed the COVID vaccine in our resident council and our elders wanted to live around others who were fully vaccinated as well. Moving forward, we made it an admission criteria that all new admits needed to be fully vaccinated with boosters."

Current COVID and Masking Guidelines

While Jefferson County's COVID transmission status (blue as of March 24) allows people to enter our facilities without masking, at this writing, Gardenside has had an outbreak of COVID. We are doing routine

outbreak testing as required, and continuing to monitor for symptoms among residents and staff. Families have been notified by our One Call System.

We do recommend visiting at this time. If you must visit, you will be required to mask and follow social distancing and handwashing guidelines. Visitors should understand they are at risk for exposure to COVID. Residents are currently remaining in their rooms to make sure we aren't spreading COVID.

To ensure the safety and well-being of our residents and staff we take COVID precautions very seriously and if families do not abide by the core principles of infection control, they will be asked to leave and not

allowed to visit until further notice.

Visitors may use Door 31 or the JCH&L main entrance and the hallway door to Gardenside. Door 31 is now unlocked from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The JCH&L main entrance is open the hours that the fitness center is open.
