Current COVID and Masking Guidelines

While Jefferson County's COVID transmission status (red as of April 21) requires people to mask when they enter the facility, restrictions at Gardenside have actually been able to be loosened in the past week.

Visiting is once again encouraged, and residents are out of isolation. You no longer need to check in at the nurses station when you visit. As long as Jefferson County is in the red zone, we will require visitors to mask.

As always, please do not visit if you have symptoms of illness.

We had a month of outbreak testing and we thank our residents' families for their patience and understanding as we did the best we could to protect our residents' health and follow all guidelines.

To ensure the safety and well-being of our residents and staff we take COVID precautions very seriously and if families do not abide by the core principles of infection control, they will be asked to leave and not allowed to visit until further notice.

Visitors may use Door 31 or the JCH&L main entrance and the hallway door to Gardenside. Door 31 is now unlocked from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The JCH&L main entrance is open the hours that the fitness center is open.




April birthdays celebrated
