5 Star Rating again!

JCH&L Gardenside has once again received a 5 Star rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid. Five stars indicate much above average quality.

We were rated at 4 stars for a few months in late 2023-early 2024. We recently got word that we regained 5 Star status. Rating are publicly available on the agency's Nursing Home Compare website at <u>www.medicare.gov/nursinghomecompare</u>.


Raffle tickets are now available for purchase, and tshirts will be available the week before the car show.


